Rise Uganda is officially launched!

It all started with Derick and Lawrence, two brothers whose family could not afford their education fee. Helping them light up a spark that would only grow. The desire to bring education to a growing number of disadvantaged kids in Uganda together with months of dedication by our team and its local partners led to the creation of Rise Uganda on March 21, 2021. Rise Uganda emerged as the crystallization of our team's resolve to have an impact in favor of the less fortunate. Rise Uganda is composed by very different individualities that complete each other. Passion and hard teamwork are what unites us.

I am grateful and proud of our team who is mature enough for this long-term commitment and will make the necessary sacrifices in order to help those who need it the most in the years to come.

Uganda is a country where only 1 out of 4 children benefits from secondary education and where youth's unemployment rates are the highest of the continent. Indeed, schools are expensive and their quality often does not meet basic standards. In this context, Covid-19 and the closing of schools since March 2020 really came as an additional unnecessary curse.

Will students go back to school after having had no exposure to it for several months? Will hesitating parents continue to make the effort to send their children to an expensive school? What will happen to the approximately 15 million children in Uganda (1.5 billion worldwide) that were left without an education for the most crucial development period of their lives? For all these reasons, Rise Uganda had to intervene for education even if our primary objective of accompanying the school-enrolment process of vulnerable children could temporarily not be met. Starting with donations from our team and some close friends and family, we have so far been able to support school material and interventions for 50 children during 6 months thanks to one of our first local partners SmartToto. All the work was done in an emergency context and we were able to develop a solid structure and essential internal processes which will enable us to help more efficiently on long term basis. Even if we are proud of what we achieved in this emergency context, we are already looking forward to all schools reopening. Rise Uganda is ready to meet



its most fundamental goal of bringing children back into schools. For next year, our initial goal will be to guarantee long-term access to primary and secondary education for 100 children. We will work hard in order

to extend our influence in Switzerland through the organization of networking and informative events while writing thorough grant requests in order to ensure private and public support for the education in Uganda.

Through our social media and events, we will update those who follow us on the importance of fostering education in Uganda while being a bridge for them and making it simple for anyone to help by donating in a perfectly transparent way. It will systematically be followed-up by information regarding the use of the donations.

On the eve of our annual general assembly, we are looking forward to presenting all our members what we did so far and what our goals for 2021 are. In these difficult times, our principle of resilience will be more important than ever.

However, we do know without a doubt that each effort we make in favor of vulnerable childern's education will be worth it. We will work hard to make their lives meaningful and we will keep fostering education through all the means at our disposal no matter the challenges to come.

Let us work together towards the objective of enabling every single child to join his or her friends in the process of growing, nurturing dreams, developing confidence, creating friendships, and seizing life opportunities.

No child should remain home or in the streets while watching his or her friends going to school.

Performance Summary 2020


Financial summary

The year 2020 was marked with the launch of the association. From a financial standpoint, the launch was followed by internet costs (particularly for setting up the website) and advertising costs.

From the second semester, Rise Uganda was able to finance the enrollment of children in school. This first aid was made possible thanks to the financial contributions of the members of the committee and the contributions of our generous donors.

The figures presented are in Swiss francs.

The result for the year 2020 is an operating profit of 4'059CHF for 1'500CHF budgeted.
